
As Principal, I operate an open door policy and welcome anyone to contact me directly with any concerns and I will always work with my staff to find positive solutions.

The Curriculum





Our aim is to provide an excellent education for all our students; an education which brings out the best in all of them and prepares them for success in life. Our curriculum is designed to provide children with the core knowledge they need for success in education and later life, to maximise their cognitive development, to develop the whole person and the talents of the individual and to allow all children to become active and economically self-sufficient citizens.

By teaching our curriculum well we develop pupils' cultural capital: "the essential knowledge that pupils need to be educated citizens, introducing them to the best that has been thought and said and helping to engender an appreciation of human creativity and achievement." (DFE National Curriculum, 2014)

At Central Academy our curriculum intent alligns with the United Learning core curriculum, founded on these core principles:

- **Entitlement** We believe that all children have the right to learn what is in the United Learning Curriculum; schools have a duty to ensure that all children are taught the whole of it.
- Mastery We want all students to achieve a full understanding of the knowledge specified in the Curriculum for each year, and teaching should not move on until this is achieved.
- **Stability** We won't constantly amend the Curriculum: while we should make occasional adjustments in the light of feedback and experience, we will aim for stability over many years, so that teachers can develop expertise, and we constantly build assessments and teaching materials to support the Curriculum.
- Concepts not context The Curriculum is intended as a concise specification of knowledge and content to be taught and learned; it is for schools and teachers to decide how to teach and bring it to life.

At Central Academy every student should:

- Have a strong set of core values aligned with the school and know how to apply this in their studies and in later life
- Develop strong relationships with peers from a range of backgrounds and with adults
- Know the difference between right and wrong and know what it takes to be a Central citizen
- Listen to others' views and know when to challenge/question in a positive way
- Understand the importance of learning and that the learning journey requires a lot of resilience in order to be successful
- Have an understanding on where they are and where they want to be
- Understand the value of technology and understand how negative use can be harmful
- Be safe and sensible when using the internet and social media
- Have a full rounded educational experience understanding the importance of family, community and what makes a true Central citizen.

Teaching & Learning



At Central Academy we are very proud to have a diverse and highly qualified range of teachers who combine their own personal expertise and knowledge to plan well-sequenced lessons for all students to maximise their learning. Our approach is underpinned by Rosenshine's Principles in conjunction with Doug Lemov's 'Teach like A Champion' to ensure all students can engage in learning.

All of our lessons are forensically planned to ensure that the appropriate level of challenge and support is provided to all students. We are also very proud to have a range of dedicated Learning Support Assistants who work with our teachers to ensure every student, no matter what their starting point, can be successful.

As a school we are very proud of our new Home Learning provision. This provision is an important part of school life and as a parent it is very simple and easy to follow so you can support your child with their learning. Our Home Learning Program operates through Microsoft Teams and builds on learning that has taken place in lessons. All subjects are covered in our Home Learning provision. As a school, we also provide a Home Learning Club each evening from 3:00 – 4:00 pm for any students wishing to have some personalised support from one of our teachers.

Education with Character

Education with Character is part of everyday life at Central Academy. We aim to provide a wide range of experiences outside their formal lessons to broaden horizons and create lifelong memories. As a school, we have a diverse range of extra-curricular opportunities from sports and the arts to the STEM club and much more. Every year we build on this provision as new technology and interests develop within our school community. In Year 7 we run a residential for all students to provide a unique experience outside of their day-to-day school life.

From Year 9 our students have the opportunity to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award, which is a highly esteemed and rigorous programme designed to challenge their physical fitness, leadership, teamwork, personal development and community involvement.

In addition to this all students will take part in our Tutor Reading Program. This guarantees a minimum of 60 minutes of reading each week with their tutor. For our Year 7 students they will also have the opportunity to take part in our Cumbria University Reading Program, where they have one to one support with university students.

Working with local businesses and education establishments has always been vital here at Central. We are very fortunate to have a dedicated Careers Officer who works with all students Year 7-13 to support, guide and provide career opportunities. We collaborate with further and higher education establishments to offer independent advice to assist students in identifying the right path to suit their individual needs and aspirations. We are very proud of our careers provision with our students receiving top university offers and career opportunities at the end of their study.



The House System & Leadership



Student leadership is an important part of developing our students' character and help prepare them for life beyond Central Academy. We offer a range of leadership opportunities across the school which continue to grow year on year.

All students have the opportunity to take part on our sports leadership program. This involves developing key coaching and leadership skills and working closely with our primary school community to deliver a range of sporting competitions and events.

We are also very proud to have a Student Council. This involves all year groups who work together with staff to improve key aspects in the school. This group of leaders have been key in some recent developments from the rewards system to being involved in some staff interviews.

This year we are implementing a new house system alongside our sister school, Morton Academy. All students will be part of a house competing for the house shield in a variety of inter-house competitions. Our house names are named after our Carlisle Roman Heritage; Hadrian House, Luguvalium House and Valantia House.

Pastoral Support

We have a strong focus on high standards of behaviour and conduct for all students underpinned by our core values. We believe that all students have the right to disruption free learning every lesson, every day. We are very proud of our pastoral care and safeguarding systems which ensure that all students feel safe and are confident in their learning environment.

Each student has a Form Tutor who will see them every day during form time and every year group have a non-teaching Head of Year, as well as a teaching Head of Year. We also have a Mental Health Lead to support students with their mental health, as well as access to a Mental Health Practitioner and Barnardo's Family Support.

We have a strict uniform policy which has changed for September 2021 with the introduction of a blazer. We expect our students to wear their uniform with pride and be excellent ambassadors for Central Academy in the local community and beyond.

Year 7 Outside Area

We know the transition from primary school can be a daunting experience for any child. Therefore, at Central Academy we provide a private outdoor space for Year 7 students with a range of benches and table tennis tables, this area has always been very popular in recent years. Students have the option to spend their break and lunch time in this space or mix with the other year groups.



Manchester United & Carlisle United Foundation



We are very proud to have our own Manchester United and Carlisle United Practitioners in school providing a unique opportunity for any student in the Carlisle area. We are the only school, north of Lancashire that has this unique provision and all students have benefitted over the past 18 months since the partnership began. The main purpose of the partnership is to work with a range of students to provide mentoring and interventions to support both pastorally and academically. Alongside this, the Foundation provide a suite of holiday camps for all students to access unique learning experiences. This has involved army camps, sports camps as well as community projects.

The Foundation also feeds into our whole school rewards system. Already this year students have had personalised tours at Old Trafford and Brunton Park, tickets to matches, as well as our Adidas rewards bundles. This is just a snapshot of the type of rewards our students have received through the Foundation.








Sixth Form
