Sport - The U12 rugby squad played a double header away at Nelson Thomlinson School, Wigton on Thursday 24th January. It was a rearranged fixture which had fallen victim of some poor weather prior to the Christmas break.

We were able to field two sides and play two games of 10 a-side. It was great to take so many willing and enthusiastic students.

The teams were split evenly in ability and were playing an A & B side from Nelson.
