Health & Social Care - International Women's Day (8 March) is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. Sport Relief & Ride ABC - The Academy supported Sport Relief for some fantastic fundraising activity in the lead up to Friday 23rd March. This year's Sport Relief was all about doing whatever moves you to raise money and change lives through physical activity and sport.

United Learning was honoured to be partnering with Sport Relief this year. The money raised will be split between Sport Relief (75%) and United Learning's SITUPS programme (25%). SITUPS stands for School Improvement Through Using the Power of Sport.

The catalyst for the activities was a charity cycle ride from Ashford to Bournemouth to Carlisle (Ride ABC). Two United Learning central office workers, Shaun and Bruce, cycled the 600 mile route over eight days between the 5th and 12th March. On the 12th March we were honoured to be chosen as the finishing point for the ride and the whole of the Academy surrounded the atrium to welcome the riders with balloons, banners and a standing ovation.

To celebrate their achievement Years 7 and 8 took part in a challenge event in PE aiming to score 600 points, through activities which involved climbing, trampolining, fitness, basketball, football and distance running. To fundraise in PE lessons our students showed fantastic efforts in running the sport relief mile. Some students attempted a further challenge and a special mention goes to Mikey Norman-Baty who ran just short of five miles and Gemma Longford who ran 3.5 miles.

On Sport Relief day itself our students supported fundraising again with a non-uniform day in sports clothing. Alongside this we had sporting challenges during the day in the sports hall and a cake sale. Huge congratulations to all staff and students who raised over £1,000 from the Academy with our sponsorship money still to add to this as we go to press.

U12 Football - The U12 football team have had two recent fixtures, one against Trinity and then the City Final to nearly complete the season. There is one remaining fixture, a Cup Semi Final against UCC after Easter.

Against Trinity the boys played really well and held their own for much of the game. Trinity were the stronger side overall and had many chances. There were some fine saves by 'Man of the Match, *Declan Kirkpatrick* in goal including a penalty save. He really did keep Central in the game as Trinity pushed and probed for the winner. It ended with a 1-1 score line following and equalising goal scored by *Nathan Noble*.

The City Tournament was held on Thursday 22nd March at the Sheepmount where each city side played each other in a round robin tournament with straight games of 15 minutes each. The going was hard

from the start with a 4-0 loss against Caldew. This seemed to set the standard as the following next two games against William Howard and Trinity finished with the same scoreline. This didn't reflect the hard work and determination displayed by the team, they never gave up despite being up against some excellent teams. The final game they played Newman, which was a closer affair with Central coming out on top with a close 1-0 win with the goal coming from *Tyler Young*.

U15 Rugby - The U15 boys entered their first 7's tournament at QEGS on Thursday 8th March. They were split into two separate groups and were set to play two rounds of matches throughout the afternoon

In the first two games they were pitched against QEGS and Kirkby Stephen Grammar School.

The boys were apprehensive as they were new to the format but soon settled into some fine play and were quickly in the lead! *Jonny Boileau* broke away and used his speed to score under the posts. He did the same again before half time to ensure they were in the lead at the break. The second half was played in much the same manner with Central dominating play and scored with a

The second game looked a more difficult scenario as KS romped their first game by six tries! However, they were soon silenced when Marc Haughan put on the afterburners and scored his second. It was a close affair and the nerves were showing, but it was again Jonny Boileau who outpaced the KS team to score his second and end the game even!

The second round of games saw them face Austin Friars who were well organised and experienced. They played well against a tough opposition but were 21 points down in a short space of time. However, Marc Haughan again showed his pace and put on the afterburners to out pace the Austin Friars team and score his first of a hat-trick in this game. Austin Friars continued to play well but were hit twice more by Haughan and his pace as he completed his hat-trick and the game ended 35-21.

In their final game the boys were tired but played well against an

organised Ullswater outfit. The game ended 28 - 7 to UCC with Syzmon Klimek getting the score this time. It was a great afternoon with the boys finally realising that they can compete and beat the other schools and that training together regularly is the key!

Arts: Twenty Year 12 and 13 A Level Art and Textile students had the opportunity to participate in two printmaking workshops facilitated by staff from the Art Faculty at the Brampton Road site of the University of Cumbria. They demonstrated a new technique to our students called 'dry point' printing. They each produced three prints using different materials, based on their own photographs, so that the work complemented their current A Level project. The students were delighted with their printmaking results and they thoroughly enjoyed their experience in the University workshop.
