## Other News:

Year 10 Work Experience – A large proportion of our Year 10 students completed a weeks' work placement in a wide variety of local businesses. The vast majority found this a relevant and worthwhile experience, providing them with an insight into career pathways they may consider in the future.

Year 11 - Our Year 11 students have commenced their GCSE examinations. They are to be congratulated on their conduct within the exams and their application and engagement at the intensive revision sessions prior to each exam. Over the half term break we have a programme of revision sessions taking place and look forward to welcoming as many of them as possible to these sessions in order that they can benefit from

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input from their teachers so their learning continues over the holiday. Our Year 11 Prom for many students will take place on Friday **22**<sup>nd</sup> **June** in the Halston where they cannot only celebrate the end of their exams but the end of 11 years of education.

**Maths Challenge - Toby Matthews** of Year 10 followed up on the success of John Wightman earlier in the year, through qualifying for the Kangaroo Mathematical Challenge is his age group, which in Toby's case was Intermediate. This places him squarely in the elite group of Mathematicians for his age group and, like John, it is the first time a Central student has attained this opportunity. His reward was to sit a further, more advanced set of mindbending mathematical problems and enigma, which he did with aplomb, thoroughly earning his Certificate outcome. Well done, Toby!

Health & Social Care: Years 10 and 12 Health and Social Care students spent an excellent Discover Health Day at the University of Cumbria.

The purpose of the visit was to raise students' awareness about the wide variety of health-related careers and to excite and enthuse students in a particular subject through taking



part in a number of engaging academic workshops.

The areas students could select from were; Radiography, Nursing, Midwifery, Occupational Therapy, Social Work, Psychology, Physiotherapy and Working with Children & Families; each student attended three sessions.

The workshop sessions gave students a hands on experience which will support their decisions around progressing into a career within the health sector. They also learnt about the skills and qualifications required in the specific areas they attended.

The taster sessions were all very informative and inspiring, designed to illustrate to students the process around progression into higher education.

On their evaluations, each student felt that their day had been very informative. They had learnt about

pathways required for specific health related careers, skills necessary for the sector and a few students discussed looking for volunteer opportunities that would help them secure a job within their chosen area.

U16 Boys Football - Well done to the U16 boys for reaching the City Cup Final at Brunton Park this week. A good five years of football at Central for this team and thanks to all of the staff who supported on the night.

Cricket - U14 Cricket v Lime House -After a tough game against Nelson Thomlinson U15s the Year 9 cricket team took the bus to Lime House School, looking forward to some more practice in another competitive game. Lime House won



the toss and elected to bat first. After a good opening over by Ben *Troughear* without giving many runs away, Louis Burn took the first wicket of the day with a fine ball

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which was hit to mid-wicket and straight to Owen Reid who took a super catch. Despite this start Lime House continued to pick up runs until Lewis McDougall took two quick wickets in his over by bowling out the batsman hitting middle stump on both occasions. Elliott Routledge was on top form as wicket keeper and helped limit the runs before coming on to bowl with an accurate fast over, which troubled the batsmen, giving little away. Ben Troughear capped a fine performance in the field taking three wickets with some fast and accurate bowling which left an achievable total of 57 to try and win the game.
